Students must declare the Arts Management minor by the beginning of their junior year. Students cannot simultaneously declare an arts management minor and art history minor or art history major. Only one transfer credit course or study abroad course in art history may be accepted for the arts management minor. Only approved courses from the study abroad course equivalency database may be accepted as transfer credit.

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OPTIONAL ARTS MANAGEMENT EMPHASIS FOR ART HISTORY MAJORS:

Art history majors have the option of completing an arts management emphasis within the major by taking 3 designated arts management courses as part of the art history's major ten required lower-division and upper-division ARTH courses. The arts management emphasis also requires one course from ENGL 100GR, 101 or 112, and two courses from MGMT 160, 170, or 174, and one course from MKTG 181 or equivalent, or 186, or 190. Completion of the emphasis will be noted on the student's transcript. The arts management emphasis is for art history majors only.
